

TOUR HIGHLIGHTS – 9 NIGHTS GREECE (LAND AND CRUISE)

MYKONOS Explore the shops and boutiques of the jet-setters' favourite island.

KUSADASI (TURKEY) Opt to tour Ephesus, one of the seven churches of Revelation (Rev 2:1) which the apostle Paul had addressed (Epistle to the Ephesians).

PATMOS The island where Jesus revealed Himself to the apostle John in a vision (Rev 1:9). Opt to tour the Monastery of St John and grotto of the Apocalypse.

PORT OF RHODES Marvel at the breathtaking views of St. Paul's bay, where the apostle cast anchor having sailed from Ephesus and Cos. (Acts 21:1)

PORT OF HERAKLION Crete, another of apostle Paul's stop-overs. (Acts 27)

SANTORINI Enjoy shopping and the view of the caldera.

DELPHI Visit various kinds of temple architecture along with a museum holding masterpieces of ancient Greek sculpture such as the bronze charioteer.

KALAMBAKA METEORA means "suspended rocks". See Meteora monasteries built on massive sandstone rock pillars as well as exquisite specimens of Byzantine art, manuscripts and jewellery.

KAVALA/BIBLICAL NEAPOLIS Paul, accompanied by Silas and Timothy, first set foot in Europe on his second missionary journey (Acts 16:11).

PHILIPPI Paul delivered his first sermon here, sowing the seeds of Christianity (Epistle to the Philippians). A woman named Lydia became a Christian here (Acts 16:14). See the ruins of St. Paul's prison (Acts 16:16) and the site believed to be where Lydia was baptised (Acts 16:15).

THESSALONIKI Here the apostle Paul wrote two epistles (1 & 2 Thess) to the ancient Thessalonians. See the White Tower, (the symbol of the city), visit the archaeological museum and several churches.

VERIA/BIBLICAL BEREIA See the mountain town of Veria and the spot from where St. Paul preached the gospel (Acts 17:13)

ATHENS The city which the apostle Paul perceived had been given over to idol worship (Acts 17) compelling him to preach the Gospel to the Athenians, from beneath the Acropolis. Visit the site along with the Propylaea, Parthenon and other popular attractions in a half-day tour.

CORINTH See the Bema, the Temple of Apollo, remains of the Agora and Pyrene Fountain at this ancient city which the apostle Paul saw fit to address in two epistles (1 & 2 Cor).
