



TOUR HIGHLIGHTS – 9 NIGHTS ISRAEL

DEAD SEA

Masada Herod's royal citadel and later the last outpost of zealots during the Jewish Revolt.

Ein Gedi Prophesied to be one of the places by the Dead Sea where fishermen will cast their nets. (Eze 47:10)

Dead Sea The lowest point on earth at some 400m below sea level, it will one day support life! (Eze 47:10)

Qumran The 2000 year old Dead Sea scrolls were discovered in caves by a Bedouin boy in 1947.

TIBERIAS

Beit Shean One of the great Decapolis cities, where Jesus taught. (Mk 7:31)

Sea of Galilee The lake where Jesus called Peter, Andrew, James and John to be fishers of men. (Mt 4:18-22)

Tiberias boat ride Several gospel accounts record Jesus and His disciples spending time on the Sea of Galilee. (Mt 8:23)

Capernaum The Galilean coastal town that Jesus left Nazareth to live in (Mt 4:13)

Tabgha Traditional site of Jesus feeding over 5,000 people miraculously (Mt 14:14-21)

Mount of Beatitudes The hillside where Jesus preached His "Sermon on the Mount" (Mt 5-7)

Chorazin The city that Jesus called out for not repenting of its sins (Mt 11:21)

Ancient Boat Museum Be fascinated by an ancient boat used during the time of Jesus

Yardenit This baptismal site along the Jordan commemorates the place where Jesus was baptized by John (Mt 3:13)

GOLAN HEIGHTS

Dan Excavations & Golan Heights This area is biblical Bashan, which was known for its oaks and cattle. (Amos 4:1-2; Zech 11:2)

CAESAREA

Caesarea Philippi (Banias) Here, Jesus asked his disciples, "Whom do people say I, the Son of Man, am?" (Mt 16:13)

NAZARETH

Mount Tabor Believed to be where Jesus' transfigured Himself (Mt 17:1-9)

Cana The location of the wedding feast at which Jesus performed His first miracle - changing water into wine. (John 2:1-11)

Nazareth The town where Jesus grew up in (Mt 2)

HAIFA

Mount Carmel The mountain where God demonstrated His power and Baal's powerlessness to the prophet Elijah (1 Kgs 18)

Caesarea Maritima A coastal city, aqueduct and harbour built by Herod the Great about 25–13 BC

JERUSALEM

Mount of Olives The mountain from which Jesus ascended into heaven (Acts 1:9-12)

Dominus Flevit A teardrop-shaped chapel built in 1955 to remember the Lord who had wept over Jerusalem (Lk 19:41)

Garden of Gethsemane The olive garden at which Jesus prayed before His arrest. (Mt 26:47)

Garden Tomb Believed to be the burial and resurrection site of Jesus.

Mount Zion (Ps 48:2) calls it, "the joy of the whole earth", and "the city of the great King". The modern Mt. Zion, however, is a misnomer applied by Byzantine pilgrims who thought that the larger, flatter western hill must be the original City of David.

Church of St Peter in Gallicantu Gallicantu means "cock crowing". This place is believed to be built over the palace of Caiaphas, the high priest where Christ was mocked, and had been denied by Peter. (Mt 26:3, 69-75)



Temple Mount Identified in Jewish tradition as the area of Mount Moriah where God tested Abraham by commanding him to sacrifice his son, Isaac (Gen 22) and also the site of the 2 temples

Western Wall Also known as the Wailing Wall, it supported Herod's temple which was destroyed in 70 AD.

Davidson Center Located in the City of David, this is one of Israel's largest archaeological parks.

Church of St Anne Erected over the site believed to be the birthplace of the mother of Mary, the church possesses amazing acoustics - perfect venue for worship!

Via Dolorosa The path that Jesus is believed to have walked on as He bore the cross to Golgotha. (Lk 23:26-27)

BETHLEHEM

Bethlehem where Lord Jesus was born

Shepherd's Field This is where the angel of the Lord visited the shepherds and announced the birth of Jesus. (Lk 2:8-14)
